## **MOTION:**

## DISCUSSION:

The Redlands Oversight Board of the Successor Agency to the former Redevelopment Agency of the City of Redlands has been established to take certain actions to wind down the affairs of the former Redevelopment Agency in accordance with the California Health and Safety Code. Assembly Bill No. 1484, signed into law on June 27, 2012, significantly modifies AB 1X26. The amended provisions of the Health and Safety Codes allows the City to elect not retain the responsibility for performing housing functions previously performed by the redevelopment agency and, in such instance, provides that that if there is one local housing authority (The Housing Authority San Bernardino County) in the territorial jurisdiction of the former redevelopment agency, housing assets can be transferred to that agency.

On January 17, 2012, the Successor Agency adopted Resolution No. 7111 electing to decline the affordable housing function of the Former Agency. On June 21, 2012, the Oversight Board adopted Resolution No. OB 2012-008 acknowledging the transfer of housing assets of the Former Agency to The Housing Authority San Bernardino County. On September 26, 2012, the Successor Agency transferred to the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino all files of the Former Agency related to the Former Agency's housing assets and, on that date, the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino accepted full responsibility of the housing assets transferred.

## RESOLUTION NO. OB 2012-018

A RESOLUTION OF THE OVERSIGHT BOARD OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE FORMER REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY OF THE CITY OF REDLANDS ACKNOWLEDGING TRANSFER OF HOUSING ASSET FILES PURSUANT TO HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 34176

WHEREAS, Health and Safety Code section 34176 allows a city, county, or city and county to elect to not retain the responsibility for performing housing functions previously performed by the redevelopment agency and, in such instance, provides that that if there is one local housing authority in the territorial jurisdiction of the former redevelopment agency, housing assets can be transferred to that agency; and

WHEREAS, on January 17, 2012, the Successor Agency adopted Resolution No. 7111 electing to decline the affordable housing function of the Former Agency; and

WHEREAS, if a city does not elect to retain the responsibility for performing housing functions previously performed by a redevelopment agency, all the rights, powers, assets, liabilities, duties, and obligations associated with the housing activities of the redevelopment agency, excluding any amounts in the low and moderate income housing fund, shall be transferred as follows:

- (1) Where there is no local housing authority in the territory or jurisdiction of the former redevelopment agency, to the Department of Housing and Community Development.
- (2) Where there is one local housing authority in the territory or jurisdiction of the former redevelopment agency, to that local housing authority.
- (3) Where there is more than one local housing authority in the territory or jurisdiction of the former redevelopment agency, to the local housing authority selected by the city that authorized the creation of the redevelopment agency; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34175 and the California Supreme Court's decision in *California Redevelopment Association, et al. v. Ana Matosantos, et al.* (2011) (53 Cal. 4th 231), on February 1, 2012 all assets, properties, contracts, leases, books and records, buildings, and equipment of the former Redevelopment Agency of the City of Redlands (the "Former Agency") transferred to the control of the successor agency to the Former Agency (the "Successor Agency") by operation of law; and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2012, this Oversight Board adopted Resolution No. OB 2012-008 acknowledging the transfer of housing assets of the Former Agency to the housing successor pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 34176, and further directed the

Successor Agency to transfer housing responsibilities and all rights, powers, and duties to the housing successor if, and to the extent, such transfer had then-already not taken place; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2012, the Successor Agency transferred to the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino all files of the Former Agency related to the Former Agency's housing assets and, on that date, the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino accepted full responsibility of the housing assets transferred;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Oversight Board of the Successor Agency to the former Redevelopment Agency of the City of Redlands as follows:

- Section 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are a substantive part of this Resolution.
- Section 2. The Oversight Board hereby acknowledges the transfer of the files of the Former Agency relating to its Housing Assets to the Housing Authority of the County of San Bernardino.
- <u>Section 3.</u> Pursuant to California Health and Safety Code section 34179, all actions taken by the Oversight Board may be reviewed by the State of California Department of Finance, and, therefore, this Resolution shall not be effective for five (5) business days, pending a request for review by the State of California Department of Finance.

TO THE HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTION 34179.5.

## **MOTION:**

"I move to Adopt Resolution No. OB 2012-019."

## DISCUSSION:

Redlands (the "Oversight Board") has been established to direct the Successor Agency to take certain actions to wind down the affairs of the former Redevelopment Agency in accordance with the California Health and Safety Code. Assembly Bill No. 1484, signed into law on June 27, 2012, significantly modifies AB 1X26, the redevelopment agency dissolution bill. Health and Safety Codes Section 34179.5 requires the Successor Agency, in part, to prepare an independent accounting report (Due Diligence) of its Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund and determine the amount of cash and cash equivalents determined to be available for allocation to taxing entities. These requirements include, but are not limited to:

- Successor Agency must employ a licensed accountant to conduct the due diligence review;
- 2. The licensed accountant must have experience and expertise in local government accounting; and
- 3. The county auditor-controller must approve the licensed accountant.

Health and Safety Code Section 34179.6(c) requires the Due Diligence Review be completed by October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 and transmitted to the various review agencies. Further, Section 34179.6(b) requires that the Oversight Board convene a public comment session to take place at least five business days before the oversight board holds the approval vote. The Oversight Board met on October 4, 2012, no public comments were received.

The Oversight Board must now review, approve, and transmit to the State of California Department of Finance and the San Bernardino County Auditor-Controller the determination of the amount of cash and cash equivalents that are available for disbursement to taxing entities as determined according to the method provided in Section 34179.5.

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2012, pursuant to Health and Safety Code sections 34179.6 and 34180, the Successor Agency submitted to the Oversight Board, the county administrative officer, the county auditor-controller, the State Controller and the Department of Finance the due Diligence Review and a copy of the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179.6, upon receipt of the Due Diligence Review, and at least five business days before the Oversight Board considers the approval of the Due Diligence Review, the Oversight Board must hold a public comment session (the "Public Comment Session") at which time the public has an opportunity to hear and be heard on the results of the Due Diligence Review and at which time the Oversight Board considers the opinions, if any, offered by the county auditor-controller on the results of the Due Diligence Review; and

WHEREAS, on October 4, 2012 the Oversight Board held the Public Comment Session pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 34179.6; and

WHEREAS, by October 15, 2012, for the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund for all other funds and accounts, the Oversight Board shall review, approve, and transmit to the State of California Department of Finance and the San Bernardino County Auditor-Controller the determination of the amount of cash and cash equivalents that are available for disbursement to taxing entities as determined according to the method provided in Section 34179.5;

We have performed the procedures enumerated in Attachment A for the Low and Moderate Housing Fund, which were agreed to by the California State Controller's Office and the State of California Department of Finance (State Agencies) solely to assist you in ensuring that the dissolved redevelopment agency is complying with Assembly Bill 1484, Chapter 26, Section 17's amendment to health and safety code 34179.5. This agreed-upon procedures engagement was conducted in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Management of the successor agency is responsible for providing all the information obtained in performing these procedures. The sufficiency of these procedures is solely the responsibility of those parties specified in the report. Consequently, we make no representations regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.

As stated above, the scope of this engagement was limited to performing the procedures identified in Attachment A, which specified the "List of Procedures for the Due Diligence Review" obtained from the California Department of Finance Website.

The results of the procedures performed are identified in Attachment B1 through B11.

We were not engaged to and did not conduct an audit, the objective of which would be the expression of a certified opinion as to the appropriateness of the results of the procedures performed. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. Had we performed additional procedures, other matters might have come to our attention that would have been reported to the Successor Agency.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of the Successor Agency Oversight Board, the Successor Agency and the applicable State Agencies, and is not intended to be, and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties. This restriction is not intended to limit distribution of this report, which is a matter of public record.

- 3. If the State Controller's Office has completed its review of transfers required under both Sections 34167.5 and 34178.8 and issued its report regarding such review, attach a copy of that report as an exhibit to the AUP report. If this has not yet occurred, perform the following procedures:

Obtain a listing prepared by the Successor Agency of transfers (excluding payments for goods and services) from the former redevelopment agency to any other public agency or to private parties for the period from January 1, 2011 through January 31, 2012. For each transfer, the Successor Agency should describe the purpose of the transfer and describe in what sense the transfer was required by one of the Agency's enforceable obligations or other legal requirements. Provide this listing as an attachment to the AUP report.
  - b. Obtain a listing prepared by the Successor Agency of transfers (excluding payments for goods and services) from the Successor Agency to any other public agency or private parties for the period from February 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012. For each transfer, the Successor Agency should describe the purpose of the transfer and describe in what sense the transfer was required by one of the Agency's enforceable obligations or other legal requirements. Provide this listing as an attachment to the AUP report.
  - c. For each transfer, obtain the legal document that formed the basis for the enforceable obligation that required any transfer. Note in the AUP report the absence of any such legal document or the absence of language in the document that required the transfer.

- Perform the following procedures:
  - a. Obtain from the Successor Agency a summary of the financial transactions of the Redevelopment Agency and the Successor Agency in the format set forth in the attached schedule for the fiscal periods indicated in the schedule. For purposes of this summary, the financial transactions should be presented using the modified accrual basis of accounting. End of year balances for capital assets (in total) and long-term liabilities (in total) should be presented at the bottom of this summary schedule for information purposes.
  - b. Ascertain that for each period presented, the total of revenues, expenditures, and transfers accounts fully for the changes in equity from the previous fiscal period.
  - c. Compare amounts in the schedule relevant to the fiscal year ended June 30, 2010 to the state controller's report filed for the Redevelopment Agency for that period.
  - d. Compare amounts in the schedule for the other fiscal periods presented to account balances in the accounting records or other supporting schedules. Describe in the report the type of support provided for each fiscal period.
- 5. Obtain from the Successor Agency a listing of all assets of the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund as of June 30, 2012 for the report that is due October 1, 2012 and a listing of all assets of all other funds of the Successor Agency as of June 30, 2012 (excluding the previously reported assets of the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund) for the report that is due December 15, 2012. When this procedure is applied to the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund, the schedule attached as an exhibit will include only those assets of the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund that were held by the Successor Agency as of June 30, 2012 and will exclude all assets held by the entity that assumed the housing function previously performed by the former redevelopment agency. Agree the assets so listed to recorded balances reflected in the accounting records of the Successor Agency. The listing should be attached as an exhibit to the appropriate AUP report.
- **6.** Obtain from the Successor Agency a listing of asset balances held on June 30, 2012 that are restricted for the following purposes:
  - a. Unspent bond proceeds:
    - i. Obtain the Successor Agency's computation of the restricted balances (e.g., total proceeds less eligible project expenditures, amounts set aside for debt service payments, etc.).
    - Trace individual components of this computation to related account balances in the accounting records, or to other supporting documentation (specify in the AUP report a description of such documentation).
    - iii. Obtain from the Successor Agency a copy of the legal document that sets forth the restriction pertaining to these balances. Note in the AUP report the absence of language restricting the use of the balances that were identified by the Successor Agency as restricted.
  - b. Grant proceeds and program income that are restricted by third parties:
    - i. Obtain the Successor Agency's computation of the restricted balances (e.g., total proceeds less eligible project expenditures).
    - ii. Trace individual components of this computation to related account balances in the accounting records, or to other supporting documentation (specify in the AUP report a description of such documentation).

- iii. Obtain from the Successor Agency a copy of the grant agreement that sets forth the restriction pertaining to these balances. Note in the AUP report the absence of language restricting the use of the balances that were identified by the Successor Agency as restricted.
- c. Other assets considered to be legally restricted:
  - i. Obtain the Successor Agency's computation of the restricted balances (e.g., total proceeds less eligible project expenditures).
  - Trace individual components of this computation to related account balances in the accounting records, or to other supporting documentation (specify in the AUP report a description of such documentation).
  - iii. Obtain from the Successor Agency a copy of the legal document that sets forth the restriction pertaining to these balances. Note in the AUP report the absence of language restricting the use of the balances that were identified by Successor the Agency as restricted.
- d. Attach the above mentioned Successor Agency prepared schedule(s) as an exhibit to the AUP report. For each restriction identified on these schedules, indicate in the report the period of time for which the restrictions are in effect. If the restrictions are in effect until the related assets are expended for their intended purpose, this should be indicated in the report.

## 7. Perform the following:

- a. Obtain from the Successor Agency a listing of assets as of June 30, 2012 that are **not** liquid or otherwise available for distribution (such as capital assets, land held for resale, long-term receivables, etc.) and ascertain if the values are listed at either purchase cost (based on book value reflected in the accounting records of the Successor Agency) or market value as recently estimated by the Successor Agency.
- b. If the assets listed at 7(A) are listed at purchase cost, trace the amounts to a previously audited financial statement (or to the accounting records of the Successor Agency) and note any differences.
- c. For any differences noted in 7(B), inspect evidence of disposal of the asset and ascertain that the proceeds were deposited into the Successor Agency trust fund. If the differences are due to additions (this generally is not expected to occur), inspect the supporting documentation and note the circumstances.
- d. If the assets listed at 7(A) are listed at recently estimated market value, inspect the evidence (if any) supporting the value and note the methodology used. If no evidence is available to support the value and\u00edor methodology, note the lack of evidence.

## 8. Perform the following:

- a. If the Successor Agency believes that asset balances need to be retained to satisfy enforceable obligations, obtain from the Successor Agency an itemized schedule of asset balances (resources) as of June 30, 2012 that are dedicated or restricted for the funding of enforceable obligations and perform the following procedures. The schedule should identify the amount dedicated or restricted, the nature of the dedication or restriction, the specific enforceable obligation to which the dedication or restriction relates, and the language in the legal document that is associated with the enforceable obligation that specifies the dedication of existing asset balances toward payment of that obligation.
  - i. Compare all information on the schedule to the legal documents that form the basis for the dedication or restriction of the resource balance in question.

- ii. Compare all current balances to the amounts reported in the accounting records of the Successor Agency or to an alternative computation.
- iii. Compare the specified enforceable obligations to those that were included in the final Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule approved by the California Department of Finance.
- iv. Attach as an exhibit to the report the listing obtained from the Successor Agency. Identify in the report any listed balances for which the Successor Agency was unable to provide appropriate restricting language in the legal document associated with the enforceable obligation.
- b. If the Successor Agency believes that future revenues together with balances dedicated or restricted to an enforceable obligation are insufficient to fund future obligation payments and thus retention of current balances is required, obtain from the Successor Agency a schedule of approved enforceable obligations that includes a projection of the annual spending requirements to satisfy each obligation and a projection of the annual revenues available to fund those requirements and perform the following procedures:
  - i. Compare the enforceable obligations to those that were approved by the California Department of Finance. Procedures to accomplish this may include reviewing the letter from the California Department of Finance approving the Recognized Enforceable Obligation Payment Schedules for the six month period from January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2012 and for the six month period July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012.
  - ii. Compare the forecasted annual spending requirements to the legal document supporting each enforceable obligation.
    - Obtain from the Successor Agency its assumptions relating to the forecasted annual spending requirements and disclose in the report major assumptions associated with the projections.
  - iii. For the forecasted annual revenues:
    - a. Obtain from the Successor Agency its assumptions for the forecasted annual revenues and disclose in the report major assumptions associated with the projections.
- c. If the Successor Agency believes that projected property tax revenues and other general purpose revenues to be received by the Successor Agency are insufficient to pay bond debt service payments (considering both the timing and amount of the related cash flows), obtain from the Successor Agency a schedule demonstrating this insufficiency and apply the following procedures to the information reflected in that schedule.
  - Compare the timing and amounts of bond debt service payments to the related bond debt service schedules in the bond agreement.
  - ii. Obtain the assumptions for the forecasted property tax revenues and disclose major assumptions associated with the projections.
  - iii. Obtain the assumptions for the forecasted other general purpose revenues and disclose major assumptions associated with the projections.
- d. If procedures A, B, or C were performed, calculate the amount of current unrestricted balances necessary for retention in order to meet the enforceable obligations by performing the following procedures.

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- Combine the amount of identified current dedicated or restricted balances and the amount of forecasted annual revenues to arrive at the amount of total resources available to fund enforceable obligations.
- ii. Reduce the amount of total resources available by the amount forecasted for the annual spending requirements. A negative result indicates the amount of current unrestricted balances that needs to be retained.
- iii. Include the calculation in the AUP report.
- 9. If the Successor Agency believes that cash balances as of June 30, 2012 need to be retained to satisfy obligations on the Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) for the period of July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013, obtain a copy of the final ROPS for the period of July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012 and a copy of the final ROPS for the period January 1, 2013 through June 30, 2013. For each obligation listed on the ROPS, the Successor Agency should add columns identifying (1) any dollar amounts of existing cash that are needed to satisfy that obligation and (2) the Successor Agency's explanation as to why the Successor Agency believes that such balances are needed to satisfy the obligation. Include this schedule as an attachment to the AUP report.
- 10. Include (or present) a schedule detailing the computation of the Balance Available for Allocation to Affected Taxing Entities. Amounts included in the calculation should agree to the results of the procedures performed in each section above. The schedule should also include a deduction to recognize amounts already paid to the County Auditor-Controller on July 12, 2012 as directed by the California Department of Finance. The amount of this deduction presented should be agreed to evidence of payment. The attached example summary schedule may be considered for this purpose. Separate schedules should be completed for the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund and for all other funds combined (excluding the Low and Moderate Income Housing Fund).
- 11. Obtain a representation letter from Successor Agency management acknowledging their responsibility for the data provided to the practitioner and the data presented in the report or in any attachments to the report. Included in the representations should be an acknowledgment that management is not aware of any transfers (as defined by Section 34179.5) from either the former redevelopment agency or the Successor Agency to other parties for the period from January 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012 that have not been properly identified in the AUP report and its related exhibits. Management's refusal to sign the representation letter should be noted in the AUP report as required by attestation standards.
