4. STATUS REPORTS

- A. City Council Liaison Report There was an excellent showing at both the Orange Ball Drop and Tree Lighting Ceremony. It was suggested that live music be played during the Orange Ball Drop.
- B. FCS staff report on Recreation activities- The FCS staff detailed a recent activity in which "Teens Inspiring Others", Common Vision Coalition, and the Institute for Public Strategies partnered for a tobacco litter cleanup by teenagers in Sylvan Park. The San Manuel Band of Mission Indians has approved a \$25,000 proactive gift to the City of Redlands Senior Services Division. This will go to both the Joslyn and Redlands Community Senior Centers. The Commission viewed a list of volunteer opportunities from the Redlands Recreation Division.
- C. FCS Staff Report

 - b. *Filming policies and procedures in Prospect Park* The FCS Staff have not discovered any violations, but will continue looking into filming procedures.
 - c. Redlands Bowl- none forthcoming.

Redlands High School Speech and Debate team competed at Claremont High School on January 4th, and will compete at Eisenhower High School on January 11. The commission requested to view the 2013 Project Priority List. Approval of the Goals and Project Priority List for FY 2019-2020 was approved with a motion from Commissioner Davis-Schultz and, seconded by Commissioner Hebden, and passed unanimously.
- B. Subcommittee Report on sports field usage- The Subcommittee plans to meet with AYSO and RBY in January. More information will be provided at the February meeting.

A. Painting of Israel Beal and Texonia Park Basketball courts- Jessica Bruny and Vanessa Vizard from Music Changing Lives spoke about their proposal to paint the Israel Beal and Texonia park basketball courts. They demonstrated some artwork from local artists, and the commission voted for which pieces they liked. Each court will cost around \$5000 dollars to paint. By reaching out to high school ASB, high school art classes, and sending out emails to all RUSD students, they hope to spread a message of "Spread Paint not Hate". Students will be able to choose the designs they like, and will be invited to paint the basketball courts. This project was approved with a motion from Chair Collins, seconded by Commissioner Wells, and passed unanimously.
