Briefly describe review procedures.	The City of Redlands adopted the MWELo into our Municipal Code, and requires the submittal of a Landscape Plan Check for all projects subject to WELo. Upon receipt of a Landscape Plan Check application, planning staff will verify all landscape and irrigation plan submittal requirements are met and ensure the water budget calculations meet the requirements of the WELo. Planning staff will comment on the submitted landscape and irrigation plans accordingly, and approve the plans when all requirements have been met.
Describe actions to verify compliance.	Staff will verify all required materials have been submitted for landscape plan check, ensure the water budget calculations are submitted with the water efficient landscape worksheet, and verifies the water efficient landscape requirements are met.
