




Steel and granite sculpture

Depicts Albert K. and Alfred H. Smiley



Widows and Orphans Memorial


Linda Hundevadt Pew, sculptor






Nylon umbrellas suspended on wire and held by u-bolts

The Orange Street Alley umbrellas were originally suggested by former city manager Enrique Martinez



Sister Cities Clock Tower


Dan & Dina Romero, sculptor

Depicts arches with clocks set to the local time for Linli China, Hino Japan, and San Miguel de Allende Mexico. Set in the center of the piece is a metal track on which cue balls roll down and are then lifted via an ascending chain mechanism

Currently on display in Ed Hales Park located at North 5<sup>th</sup> Street and East State Street
















LGBTQ Mural
